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Pupil Premium for 2020/21

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) is an amount of money allocated to schools through their budget based on the number of children in receipt of Free School Meals (FSM). Each school allocates the grant to provide for the needs of its pupils with the aim of narrowing the gap between the progress and attainment of the lowest achieving children and the national expectations for their year group. The allocation of funds in each school will depend on the school context and the needs of individual children and groups of pupils. This means that there must be a flexible use of the money that may result in money being allocated differently across schools as priorities may vary year on year.

In our school we have 458 pupils on our roll. Our current PPG is £109,903 based on 78 pupils and it is being used to help fund:

- Continued appointment of a Reading Recovery teacher for 0.5 FTE
- Code X Catch Up and Wave 3 accelerated reading interventions
- Appointment of HLTA (0.6) to work with PP children in Year 5/6
- Appointment of a PSP team and continuation of alternative provision
- Cohort provision with additional adults
- Appointment of LSAs and teacher to run alternative curriculum and hub provision for targeted groups of children
- Forest school provision for children
- THRIVE based learning and training for staff and pupils
- Termly contribution for curriculum enrichment

The reason (purpose) we have made these decisions are:

- Targeted one-to-one interventions
- Targeted group work for work with vulnerable groups
- Small group work to improve literacy and numeracy skills across the school
- Self esteem and risk taking learning experiences through Forest School focusing on learning strategies

The recent benefits/outcomes we see for our pupils arising from our actions are:

- Improved self esteem
- Consistent good behaviour throughout the school
- More focussed approach to learning in addressing the developmental delays in children
- PP children achieved a progress score of 1.09 in reading
- PP children achieved a progress score of 0.18 in writing
- PP children achieved a progress score of 1.56 in maths
- 57% of our PP children achieved standard in reading, writing and maths combined.
